



SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The Music City Classic (MCC) Scholarship was established to assist outstanding need based students pursuing an undergraduate education in any academic discipline area of interest and is based upon financial need, academic achievement and contribution to the community. This particular scholarship provides assistance in the form of a **one-time \$250** stipend that is awarded to the chosen applicant for his/her freshman year, who enrolls in and attends, the college of the applicant's own choice in the Fall of 2018. One student from each of the 13 MCC Recipient Schools will be chosen to receive an MCC Scholarship. Primarily, this scholarship is provided to the individual enrolling during the applicant's freshman year. Though the stipend is usually sent directly to the individual's college/university in the fall semester, if special circumstances prevent the applicant from attending in the fall, and requires that he or she enters the college/university during the spring or summer session, then the applicant must notify MCC directly about these circumstances and MCC will delay the submission of these funds until the semester the applicant enrolls for his/her freshman year. The MCC scholarship is a one-time award to the scholarship recipient for his/her freshman academic year. **Deadline for submission of the MCC Scholarship Application is OCTOBER 15, 2017** and should be submitted by mail to 4300 Kings Lane, Nashville, TN 37218 or by email to mccscholarship@comcast.net with the subject line reading the name of the applicant, the school the High School applicant is attending and the year the for which the applicant is applying. (i.e. "Mary Hill from Whites Creek High School- MCC Application for 2018".)

Criteria: To be eligible students must meet the following criteria:

1. The Applicant must be a *need-based senior high school student graduating from one of the Nashville, Davidson County schools listed on the last page of this application.

Note: *Need-based is defined as being a member of a family whose household income is \$24,000 or below, which amount should not include government assistance.

2. The Applicant must have a cumulative high school grade point average of **2.8** or higher based on a 4.0 scale.

3. The Applicant must have a 19 ACT or 930 SAT score or higher.
4. The Applicant must matriculate into a college or university that is accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education.

Prerequisites: In addition to submitting this application, all applicants must provide the following to be considered for the MCC Scholarship:

1. A copy of his/her student profile detailing education, work experience, accolades, accomplishments, achievements, community service/involvement and any and all extracurricular activities the student has participated in during his/her time in high school.
2. **THREE (3) LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION**, one from the Applicant's high school principal, teacher and guidance counselor, and said letters of recommendation must contain an evaluation of the Applicant's accomplishments both academic and otherwise. Letters from relatives will not be accepted.
3. A current transcript.
4. An **ESSAY** not to exceed 500 words stating the importance of **Dr. Martin Luther King's** dream for humanity and its impact on society in the 21st Century. Essay review will be confined to **Clarity, Passion and Purpose**. The Essay must be **typewritten in not less than 12 point type, and double-spaced**. Be sure the text is legible. Faintly printed essays will not be read!

Conditions:

1. This is a one-time award for the period of one academic year.
2. The chosen recipients will be notified in writing of their selection.
3. Recipients of this award automatically become fellowship members of the Music City Classic and the recipients will be required annually to send an email to the Executive Director of the Music City Classic to detailing and describing his/her progress, including any and all achievements completed during the scholarship period as well as the final graduating year. The applicant is encouraged to provide additional information about any and all achievements during the sophomore, junior year and after graduation. MCC reserves the right to feature the applicant on its website and in all of its advertising and marketing materials highlighting successes achieved by the recipient.
